Materials) / SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. For all exhibitors competing in the hunter or hunter seat equitation section, if a rider's chin strap becomes unfastened, the rider may stop, re-fasten the chin strap and continue his/her round without penalty or elimination. A judge may, but is not required to stop a rider and ask them to refasten a chin strap which has become unfastened, again without penalty to the rider. Members of the Armed Services or the Police may wear the Service Dress Uniform. BOD 1/23/11 Effective 12/1/11

4. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest meet or surpass the current ASTM standard or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.
7. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.
8. The Federation makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

This Horse Show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of the USA Equestrian, Arabian Horse Division. "EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH." Exhibitors are encouraged to read the USEF Rule Book, and particularly Chapter AR, for the complete Arabian Horse rules, class descriptions and judging specifications. This premium list is based on the current rules of USEF; any changes or corrections will automatically become a part of this premium list. Each participant in these shows is responsible for a knowledge of and is subject to USEF Rules. Questions not covered by USEF rules shall be decided by the Show Committee and its decision will be final.

AHA SADDLE SEAT MEDAL CLASS

In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform two or more individual tests from USEF Tests (EQ 120) 1-15 or EC equivalent. Markers shall not be used.

AHA REINING SEAT MEDAL CLASS

- a. All contestants are required to perform a Reining pattern as outlined in USEF Reining, or EC equivalent. (Res 25-06)
- b. Order go will be done by draw.
- c. Bits must be dropped and inspected by the Judge or designated official, and all riders must dismount for this inspection. If called for in the ring, assistance, if necessary, may be had from one of the ring officials.
- d. Reins shall not be removed from the horse's neck while inspecting bits.
- e. In the event the total score is tied, the tie will first be broken by the exhibitor with the highest equitation score. Should a tie still exist, the tie shall be broken by reining rules found in COMP 812.
- f. In an AHA Reining Seat Medal class an off pattern rider is eliminated and is not eligible to win a medal or ribbon.
- g. The prescribed AHA Reining Seat Equitation Score Sheet must be used and posted in accordance with the USEF Arabian, Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian Division, Subchapter Working Western rule regarding score sheets. (Res. 25-06)
- h. See the USEF Equitation Division rule regarding "Numbers" under Conduct. (Res. 8/07)

AHA HUNTER SEAT NOT TO JUMP MEDAL CLASS

In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform two or more individual tests from USEF, Equitation Division, Tests From Which Judges Must Choose.

AHA WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP MEDAL CLASS

Following the rail work, all contestants are required to perform a minimum of four tests the USEF Arabian, Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian Division, Subchapter Western Horsemanship. (BOD 5/06)

STABLING—12 x 12 Permanent wood stalls with dirt floors. All stalls have doors.

IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS—Every horse entered in the show will be assigned an identification number. It is important for the proper handling of the show that correct numbers be worn by riders or attendants when that horse is being shown. A fee of \$3.00 per number will be required.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR CLASSES—Children eligible for Junior Exhibitor classes shall not have reached their 18th birthday. For horse show purposes, the age of a Junior Exhibitor on December 1st shall be maintained throughout the entire year.

MAIDEN/NOVICE/LIMIT HORSE—A Maiden Class is open to horses which have not won one first place ribbon at a regular Member Show of USA Equestrian or the Canadian Equestrian Federation in the particular performance division in which they are shown. In the Arabian division, ribbons won within a section do not count in reckoning Maiden, Novice or Limit status if the animal is transferred to a new classification (e.g., Arabian Park to Arabian Western Pleasure). A Novice Horse is one which shall not have won three first place ribbons. A Limit Horse is one which shall not have won six first place ribbons. For purposes of this show, a maiden/novice/limit entry is such as of the date of the closing of the entries.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES IN CLASS—The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel a class having less than four entries or to combine or split classes as they deem necessary. In the event a class is not available, entry fee will be refunded.

STALLIONS—Stallions may be shown by ladies or children in any class permitting stallions.

POST ENTRIES—Post entries are accepted. \$25 per horse will be charged.

FOOTING—The footing at the Rose Palace is a mixture of wash sand, clay, dirt.

ARENA DIMENSIONS—Arena A is 120' x 255'. Arena B is 112' x 250'.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES—Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

SELECT RIDER—AOTR, AAOTR, JOTR, JTR – Classes are open to rider/driver/handler who have not won any of the following: (1) AHA Regional Top Five or higher in that particular performance section in which they are shown; (2) AHA National Top Ten or higher in that particular performance section in which they are shown; (3) Two AHA Regional Top Five Awards or higher in a Select class that particular performance section in which they are shown; (4) An AHA National Top Ten or higher award in a Select class in that particular performance section in which they are shown. Riders in the Arabian, Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian Divisions shall not be considered separately when competing in the same performance section. If a rider is eligible to compete as a Select rider in a performance section on December 1, said eligibility remains throughout the current competition year.

CALL FOR CLASSES – Classes will be called promptly. The two-minute gate rule will be enforced. Exhibitors are cautioned against entering the same horse in successive classes.

AR101. USEF RECOGNIZED COMPETITION AMATEUR OWNER HORSE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS.

1. A copy of the registration papers showing the owner of record with the Arabian Horse Association must be submitted with entry form.
2. Horses entered in amateur owner and junior owner classes must be registered in the name of the competitor or a member of the competitor's family, as defined by GR122. Horses registered in a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation name may be shown in Amateur Owner classes provided the family is the sole owner of the farm or entity as defined by GR122. The sale of a horse does not eliminate this registration requirement. (Contracts of Sale or Bill of Sale will not be accepted.)

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR – USEF GR801.3, 1.4, 1.7, 1.8:

3. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, all juniors riding in Hunter, Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation sections, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and

that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging GR702, and any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense by the Show Committee. No one shall approach a judge regarding a decision unless he first obtains permission from the Show Committee or Steward, who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at a proper time and place.

AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS—Any person signing the entry form or a responsible person for any individual's horses at the show must be a member of AHA. In cases where a minor does not have a trainer to sign the entry blank, the parent or guardian must sign on the trainer line and write (PARENT) after his or her name. In this case the parent/guardian does not have to be an AHA member and need not pay the single event fee. Each participant of an AHA-recognized show must have a current AHA Competition Level Membership card or a Single Event Membership must be purchased for \$35 per person. This requirement includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, and the person(s) signing the entry blank unless exempted. Any Arabian, Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian lead line or walk/trot class is exempted from the AHA member requirement.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT—Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) headline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. EC 7/21/08 Effective 12/1/08

DRUGS AND MEDICATION—The Drugs and Medications rules contained in Chapter 4 of the USEF Rule Book and pamphlet will be enforced by examination by an appointed licensed veterinarian and skilled technicians who are agents of USEF and who must be treated with respect. The examination may include physical, saliva, urine, blood tests, or any other test or procedure in the discretion of said veterinarian necessary to effectuate the purposes of this rule. All halter, equitation and performance horses will be charged \$16.00 per horse (Includes \$8 Drugs & Medications fee) to defray the expenses of testing.

CAUTION: REFUSAL TO SUBMIT A HORSE FOR EXAMINATION—WHETHER IN COMPETITION OR NOT—AND TO COOPERATE WITH THE VETERINARIANS OR HIS AGENTS CONSTITUTES A VIOLATION AND SUBJECTS THE RESPONSIBLE PERSON TO THE PENALTIES UNDER THE RULES.

ADMISSION TO RING—No person will be permitted to enter the arena except participants in the class, judges, and their assistants and the show photographer. Attendants will not be permitted in the arena unless summoned by the order of the judge.

AGE OF HORSE—For horse show purposes any horse shall be considered to be one year old on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling. Champions and Reserve Champions shall be at least two years old, except Purebred yearling geldings may compete for Champion Gelding.

AMATEUR CLASSES—Every rider or driver 18 years and over who is entered in Amateur To Ride classes must have in his or her possession an AMATEUR CERTIFICATION issued yearly by the USEF or make application for such certification at least one hour prior to riding in Amateur-To-Ride classes. Applications may be secured from the Horse Show Office.

AMATEUR/OWNER OR MEMBER OF FAMILY—For horse show purposes, the term "family" shall include the following: husband, wife, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, brother, sister, half-brother and sister, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, grandmother/father and in-laws of the same relation as stated above.

ATTIRE & EQUIPMENT—It is the tradition of the competition ring that riders and drivers be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and horses be properly presented. Chapter 8, Subchapter 8-A, GR801.

PETS—All dogs must be on a leash or incur a \$200 fine. Any person who does not comply will lose their permission to remain on the premises and/or to participate in the event, without any refund or consideration of any fees they might have paid.

FIRST AID—First aid treatment will be available at all times during performance; emergency vehicles available through 911.

HAY AND GRAIN—Hay and grain will not be available at the show grounds.

SHAVINGS—Shavings will be available from the Lone Star Classic. No hay or straw shall be used as bedding. \$30 dispersal fee for persons who bring their own shavings.

POINT SYSTEM FOR GELDING HIGH POINT: Regular halter and performance classes will be counted as follows, according to the number of horses shown and judged in a class: 1 Horse–1st=1 pt; 2 Horses–1st=2 pts, 2nd=1 pt; 3 Horses–1st=3 pts, 2nd=2 pts, 3rd=1 pt; 4 Horses–1st=4 pts; 2nd=3 pts; 3rd=2 pts, 4th=1 pt; 5 or more Horses–1st=5 pts, 2nd=4 pts, 3rd=3 pts, 4th=2 pts, 5th=1pt. **Championship Classes (halter and performance)** will be counted as above, but **Doubled**. The Champion will receive the points for 1st place and Reserve Champion will receive the points for 2nd place. Halter Championships will count the number of horses which show in the Championship class itself. If there are additional places awarded after Champion and Reserve Champion (performance classes), they will follow the system above according to number of horses shown.

See GR 117 and 146 for a definition of number of horses “Shown and Judged” and for disqualified and eliminated horses, in regards to determination of number of horses shown and judged. In the event of a tie, the horse with the best record will be 1st place winner and the runner up will be 2nd place winner. “Best Record” will be defined as the horse with the highest placings in the most classes against the most competition, as determined by the Show Committee.

GROUND FEES-MOTOR HOMES, CAMPERS—Facilities will be available on the show grounds for a limited number of self-contained house trailers, motor homes and campers at \$25 per night. Electricity is available as well as sanitary disposal facilities. Must receive PERMIT from Show Office and post on vehicle door or window.

STALLS—Stalls will be available at the same fee whether used for horses or tack and will be assigned as entries are received. STALLS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THURSDAY, APRIL 12 at 12 noon. Early arrival (prior to 12 noon on Thursday) is available at \$30.00 a stall if pre-arranged. All fees for stalls MUST accompany entries. ALL HORSES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE STALLS. The Show Management reserves the right to remove horses not stabled properly. All stalls are indoors and have stall doors. Any physical alterations made to stalls (removal of doors, alterations to partitions between stalls, etc.) which are not repaired by exhibitor will be charged to exhibitor at the rate of which their repair is charged to the show by the management of the San Antonio Rose Palace (hereinafter referred to as the Rose Palace). Horses and stalls must be kept clean and neat at all times. Refuse must be placed in dumpsters located throughout the stable area. ALL TRAILERS AND VANS MUST PARK IN DESIGNATED AREA. No unauthorized parking inside building. NO OUTSIDE BEDDING ALLOWED. Shavings will be purchased through the Lone Star Classic.

RULES—Horses shown in the Purebred, Half-Arabian, Anglo-Arabian divisions must have been issued a certificate of registration from the Arabian Horse Association and/or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry or, if under one year of age, be eligible for registry, and registration applied for and must be entered under their full registered name. Should there be any rule changes effective after printing of this Premium List, they will apply.

RESPONSIBILITY—All entries are accepted with the understanding that neither the Central Texas Arabian Horse Club (hereinafter referred to as CTAHC) nor the Rose Palace will be responsible for any loss, personal injury, or damage to horses exhibited or for any article of any kind or any nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal, or property occasioned by him or his agents or employees, or by an animal owner or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the CTAHC, its officers and directors and the Rose Palace against any and all loss, damage and liability thus occasioned including, but not limited to, any and all legal acts, including attorney fees which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of an entry form to the Show Secretary shall constitute an acceptance of the provisions herein set forth. **WARNING:** Under Texas law (Chapter 87, Civil Practice and Remedies Code), an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities. Effective Sept. 1, 1995.

DISCIPLINE—Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, rider or member of the family of the person exhibiting or participating in these shows, will disqualify the horse from adjudication. The management reserves to itself the right to remove a groom, horse, rider or driver from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

PROTEST—A protest must be filed as set forth in GR 603.

DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY RULES—Should any question arise not provided for in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee (CTAHC Officers & Board of Directors), whose decision shall be final.

JUDGES—In the event a judge fails to attend this show or perform his/her duties, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute a judge for the one who is officially designated in the Premium List, according to USEF GR1033. It is a violation of USEF Rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show

ENTRIES—Entries close April 2, 2012. Any entries receiving a postmark after this date will be charged a post entry fee. All entries must be completed on an official entry form and have attached a valid check or money order for the total amount of appropriate fees; otherwise, the entry will not be accepted. **DO NOT SEND OPEN OR POST DATED CHECKS.** A horse must be entered in the name of the legal owner only and must be entered under its full registered name. No horse may be entered on more than one entry form. **ALL ENTRIES MUST HAVE A PHOTOSTATIC COPY OF THE REGISTRATION PAPERS SENT WITH ENTRIES.** (Do not send originals.) Entries received without these copies **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.** Owners, riders, handlers, trainers names on entry form must be exactly like name appears on current AHA Membership Card. Your AHA and USEF membership numbers **MUST** be on the Entry Form plus copies of current membership cards for both USEF and AHA must be included with your entry, otherwise USEF non-member fees will be charged and not refunded. A current AHA Competition Level Membership card is required or a Single Event Membership must be purchased for \$35 per person. All participants (rider, driver, handler, owner, trainer, agent or lessee) as provided in GR202 must present to the competition secretary a current USEF membership card or copy thereof. In the event a participant does not have his/her card or copy, he/she must pay the \$30 non-member fee; \$30 non-member amateur fee. A non-member may join USEF at the show and non-member fees will not be charged. **No Horse Numbers will be issued without your Entry Form being complete.**

NOTE: Horses will be listed in classes in the owner's name, as accorded on the registration papers. If a horse is being leased or purchased on a sales contract, the lessee or new owner may have their name listed as owner if proper documentation is provided to Show Secretary. No farm names will be listed unless the farm is the recorded owner of the horse. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** See page 11 for Amateur-Owner rules.

After that date, withdrawals accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate showing inability of the horse entry to show or in the case of an exhibitor, a doctor's certificate showing inability of the exhibitor to show, will receive a refund of class entries, USEF Fees, USEF Non-Member & AHA Single Event fees, AHA Resolution 9-90 fee, and stall fees only if made to the secretary prior to five (5) pm of the day before the beginning of the show. If horse is on the grounds, the stall fee will not be refunded. PUREBRED GELDING HIGH POINT—This show offers a High Point Award for Purebred Geldings, sponsored by Jennifer Bird. There is **No Charge**, but you **Must Enter on Entry Blank to be eligible.** Each entry will be given a point-keeping sheet, to complete and **TURN IN TO THE SHOW OFFICE BY NOON ON SUNDAY, APRIL 15, 2012.** In addition, the owner must indicate which classes they intend to enter on Sunday afternoon—these are the only classes which will be added to the subtotals submitted earlier.
